Letter to Robert Warmistry

BAH MS 3061/1/485 (former 167885)

Dated 3 January 1598, Ralph's letter addressed the diocesan Registrar Robert Warmistry as High Alderman of Worcester, his position in civic life.¹

Jhesu

Sir in my pleading in the *quare Impedit*² I must certainly set down the last incumbent ^in Dichford^3 and who presented him / which by your means already I have. I must also as near as may be derive the title from one Agard⁴ who some time was Lord of the manor and from whom Mr Ffyeldyng and I do both claim the means⁵ to attain this understanding as to see into the former incumbents and the patrons who preceded next before <...> Wylliam Halford⁶ presented by Mr Willington wherein I heartily pray you cause a diligent search to be made and that I may receive a copy of these records upon Saturday next by a servant of mine whom I will commend unto you. In your former letter you did signify of the several presentations from anno 1292 until the year <...>1448 in which year one Elinora Allesley did present⁷ but in John Carpenter⁸ folio 69 20 Januarii. Since that time if the records remain with you I heartily pray you that search may be made.

And so with my very hearty commendations I take my leave from Beoley the 3rd day of January 1597/98
